Vpdate on the "Biss Bill"
You will remember that last year, Senator Biss sponsored a bill limiting the amount of money employees retired from a SURS institution could earn if they returned to work at a SURS institution. This adversely

affected many of our adjuncts. Good news! At the urging of the IEA Higher Education Council, Biss has sponsored an amendment to this bill, SB 2887, exempting annuitants with annuities of less than \$10,000. This bill has passed the State Senate 39-8 and is now pending in the House.


